KILI CLIMB 2011

In January 2011, business, community and church leaders from across the world will join together to scale Mt. Kilimanjaro. At 19,330 ft. (5,891 meters), each step to the top will mark a step toward ending the water crisis for up to 50 different communities in East Africa. The event aims to raise \$1 million for clean water projects. We will match each climber with a specific village so they and their supporters know which community stands to benefit from their journey. Join us for the expedition of a lifetime!

Why KILIMANJARO?

AFRICA'S HIGHEST MOUNTAIN • WORLD'S HIGHEST FREESTANDING MOUNTAIN • SPECTACULAR!

Kilimanjaro calls many adventurers to its slopes every year. Trekking to the peak takes you from the plains of Africa through rainforest, heather and moorland, and finally to the glaciated peak that rises above the clouds at 19,330 ft. (5,895 meters). Reaching the summit is both a physical and a mental challenge.

We'll coordinate climbers' flights and accommodations, and provide skilled guides who have years

of experience on all major routes. We use a high guide/climber ratio to ensure a safe ascent. Local guides are highly trained in all aspects, including first aid. There will be an extra day on the mountain for acclimatization, to further improve the climbers' chance of success. On camping routes, quality South African and American equipment - new each season - is used (tents, sleeping mats, mess tents, etc.).



MACHAME ROUTE, KILIMANJARO

DAY 1: ARRIVE TANZANIA. Arrive at Kilimanjaro International Airport; transfer to Moshi. Dinner and overnight at the hotel. We recommend inserting one extra night in Moshi.

DAY 2: MACHAME CAMP. 3000m. ~5 hours walking; ~11km. After a briefing, transfer to the Park Gate (1640m). Hike through tropical rainforest on the beautiful Machame Route.

DAY 3: SHIRA CAMP. 3850m. 4-5 hours, ~5km. Cross from the "heather zone" into the "moorlands."

DAY 4: BARRANCO CAMP. 3976m. 6-8 hours; 10km. Trek up to the Lava Tower (4630m), then descend to Barranco Camp. An excellent way to acclimatize, but a long day.

DAY 5: KARANGU CAMP. 3995m. 4-5 hours; 5km. This is your extra acclimatization day. Climb the Barranco Wall, which is a fairly difficult scramble at altitude. Descend to Karangu camp in the Karangu Valley.

DAY 6: BARAFU CAMP. 4600m. 4-5 hrs; 4km. A long, even ascent to Barafu.

DAY 7: SUMMIT DAY. 5896m. 12-15 hrs. Leave in the early hours and climb 4-5 hours up a slope to the rim of the summit crater (Stella Point, 5750m). Continue to Uhuru Peak (5896m) - the highest point in Africa! Descend all the way to Mweka (3,600m) for your last night on the mountain.

DAY 8: MOSHI. Descend 3-4 hours to the park gate. Transfer to the hotel to celebrate!

DAY 9: DEPART. Transfer to the airport or begin a safari.
